FOREWORD

The 1984 Bibliography of Asian Studies [BAS] is the third volume printed using Apple® MacintoshTM microcomputers and an Apple LaserWriter Plus® printer. It is the second volume produced under the editorial direction of Dr. Wayne Surdam, Department of South and Southeast Asian Studies, University of California, Berkeley. With refined and programming assistance from Professor George Hart of the same Department, Dr. Surdam has further refined the format and quality of the 1984 BAS. The 1984 volume enhances the improvements evident in the 1982 and 1983 BAS volumes. This reflects the determination of the BAS editorial staff and the BAS Advisory Committee to continue to improve the Bibliography of Asian Studies. We are catching up to our production goals and anticipate that the 1985 and 1986 volumes will appear in 1989. Once the system is perfected, annual volumes should appear 18 to 24 months after the end of the year in which entries appear in print.

This on-going transformation of the Bibliography of Asian Studies is made possible by a major grant from The Andrew W. Mellon Foundation. This support enabled the Advisory Committee to purchase computer hardware and software, consult with experts in the field, and meet to assess our progress towards a fully computerized and modernized Bibliography. In time, a new subject classification system will be integrated into the BAS. This is under development with the assistance of disciplinary specialists from the fields of Asian Studies. We also plan to assemble a cumulation of materials contained in the BAS since 1970, using the same technology used to produce the annual BAS volumes. As we continue to modernize and computerize the Bibliography of Asian Studies, we encourage users to send us suggestions for further improvements as well as comments on our progress to date.

The faster processing time of the Apple® Macintosh II™ computer allowed us to considerably speed up the production of this volume. The serif font created with the Altsys® Fontographer© professional font editor increases readability. The final manuscript was prepared using Microsoft® Word© and printed on an Apple® LaserWriter Plus®. The cover was designed by Robin West using Aldus® Freehand© for the layout.

Each year the editors attempt to cover the extensive literature in the field of Asian studies as exhaustively as possible. We regularly add new periodicals for indexing and appreciate suggestions from users of this volume. This year, because of formatting problems, we were unable to include much of the literature published in Russian. It will be included in the 1985 volume. We have included here a list of periodicals on page xxii, representing the journals we are currently indexing.
