### A NOTE FROM THE EDITOR

The 1991 Bibliography of Asian Studies (BAS), with over 37,000 entries, is the most extensive annual bibliography ever published by the Association for Asian Studies. Its increase in size reflects in large measure the continuing growth in the amount of research and scholarly literature about Asia in Western languages that has accompanied the accelerated volume of publishing in general over the past several years. It is also a result of the Editor's ongoing effort to provide more comprehensive coverage of pertinent books, monographs, reference works, edited volumes, conference and symposia proceedings, and periodicals. Throughout the various stages in the production of this bibliography, considerable time and effort have been devoted not only to compiling, inputting and editing the data but also to maintaining reasonably high bibliographical and editorial standards.

The subject classification of the 1991 BAS (pages vi-vii) is identical with that of the 1990 BAS. Pages xxiii-xlviii list the edited volumes and conference proceedings that have been analyzed and the periodicals that have been indexed.

The preparation of this volume has entailed the cooperation and dedication of several individuals. Vimla Sharma, Associate Editor for South Asia (1971-1996), compiled and entered most of the monographic, periodical and analytical entries for the South Asia section. Bindu Bhatt, the recently appointed new Associate Editor for South Asia, supplemented the section with several hundred additional periodical entries. Curtis Ellett, Taveeporn Vasavakul, and other student assistants at Cornell University prepared most of the data appearing within the Southeast Asia section with the cooperation of David K. Wyatt (Cornell University) and Allen J. Riedy (Cornell University Libraries). John D. LeRoy, the recently appointed new Associate Editor for Southeast Asia, contributed some additional entries. The Editor and the student assistants who worked with her on the BAS at various points in time-particularly Elaine Wong (Lang My Huynh), Mi Hyon Kim and Alan L. Moseley—assumed responsibility for gathering and inputting all of the entries within the East Asia and Asia sections into the BAS computerized database as well as for indexing the articles from "nonarea" periodicals that are found throughout the volume. Frank Joseph Shulman (Special Assistant and Bibliographical Consultant) contributed many of the analytical entries for the edited volumes and conference proceedings, helped classify and edit the European-language entries, and continuously provided the Editor with a wide range of professional advice and other types of assistance. Alan L. Moseley, Frank Joseph Shulman, Arash Bormanshinov, and Steven I. Levine prepared and edited the Russian-language entries.

The Editor would like to acknowledge Richard C. Howard (former Assistant Chief of the Asian Division, Library of Congress) and Allen W. Thrasher (Southern Asia Section, Asian Division, Library of Congress) for generously providing Library of Congress proof slips for newly cataloged monographs; Om P. Sharma (University of Michigan Libraries) for his ongoing contributions to the South Asia section of the BAS; the library staffs at the University of Chicago, Columbia University, Cornell University, Georgetown University, Harvard University, the University of Hawaii, the Library of Congress, the University of Maryland at College Park, the University of Michigan, and the University of Hong Kong for granting the Editor and the Associate Editors access to their respective library holdings; the Computer Science Center at the University of Maryland for responding to the Editor's computer-related queries and for offering a variety of other services; the staff of the Interlibrary Loan Department of the University of Maryland Libraries for obtaining publications needed for indexing; Yan Yan Leon for her cooperation on numerous occasions; the Secretariat of the Association for Asian Studies for its help with administrative matters; the members of the BAS Advisory Committee and its past and present chairmen, William B.
