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Muslim educationists have been deliberating from time to time to diagnose the malaise and prescribe remedies to resolve the multi-dimensional challenges that confront education. During the last 20 years, four major educational conferences have been held in different parts of the Muslim world to formulate objectives and strategies for reconstruction of educational framework in the Muslim world.

The first conference was held in 1977 in Makkah Al-Mukarrama on general education and the others were held in Islamabad on Islamic concepts and curricula (1980), in Dhaka on textbook development (1981) and in Jakarta on teaching methodology (1982). In these conferences, research papers were presented on different aspects of the educational problems and the panel of experts formulated recommendations for the development of a comprehensive education policy for the Muslim Ummah.

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THE ISLAMIC FOUNDATION is an educational and research organisation devoted to making Islam a living reality in our age. For this purpose, it aims to improve human communication and develop a better understanding of Islam among all people of the world, Muslim and non-Muslim, so as to galvanise man to the message and idea of One God and the unity of mankind, as brought by all the Prophets of God throughout the ages, last of whom was the Prophet Muhammad (pbuh).
