BACKGROUND OF KIIC ESTABLISHMENT

- Islam is a thoroughly misunderstood religion in Korea, mainly caused by the pro-western education and bad influence of mass-media based on western value system and ideology.

 More than %98 of total population of South Korea is literate and %75 is graduates from higher education.

- 4. In these circumstances, to correct wrong information and distorted knowledge on Islam; to give objective research materials on Islam to academic circle, mass-media and business circle; to find the most effective Da'wah methodology in Korea, certain Muslim scholars have decided to establish KIIC under full sponsorship of the Korea Muslim Federation.
- 5. This idea is fully supported by the eminent Muslim scholars and leaders who attended the international seminar on <Islam in East Asia: History and Cultural Harmony> in Seoul, organized by Korea Muslim Federation to commemorate the 40th anniversary of Islam in Korea between August 22-24, 1997.
