### FROM THE EDITOR

We are moving. Or more precisely, we are evolving into something more substantial. Beginning in October 1981, the new *Institute* of Central Asian Affairs will be established in Oxford, England. S. Enders Wimbush, the Editor of the Communique, will direct this new enterprise. The Communique will become the Newsletter of the Institute of Central Asian Affairs; it will be issued from Oxford in the future.

The Institute of Central Asian Affairs is intended to assist in the development and articulation of the interests and concerns of individuals and groups studying in Central Asia. A more complete description of ICAA's tasks will appear in the first issue of the Newsletter, to be issued within the next few months. At this time, it is possible to say that ICAA's interests are several: 1) to publish a new journal devoted to Central Asia; 2) to provide basic information about events in Central Asia to a wide audience; 3) to encourage and support research on Central Asia where funds permit; and 4) to serve as a center through which interested individuals can learn of one another and of one another's work and interests.

RFE/RL, Munich, has a vacancy for an additional research analyst of Soviet Central Asian affairs. The position entails keeping abreast of current developments in two or three of the five republics in Soviet Central Asia and, on short notice, writing in English concise, clear analyses of events and trends for use by the 21 broadcast services of RFE/RL. Candidates should have an advanced degree or equivalent experience in Soviet affairs, preferably Soviet nationalities policy or Soviet Central Asia. They

should have fluent written and spoken English; an excellent reading knowledge of Russian; preferably, a good knowledge of one of the languages of the peoples of Soviet Central Asia, and reading knowledge of German and/or French; and a sound record of publications on Soviet nationalities policy or Central Asia. Besides this, they should have a demonstrated or demonstrable ability to write quickly and cogently.
