Concerning people's religious belief, the government adheres to the law stipulated in the Constitution and the people may enjoy freedom of religious belief and faith in the Republic of China when they own freedom, and they organizations enjoy full management opportunities.

The people of the Republic of China are free to accept, change, or abandon any particular religious faith, without protection of the church or state, solely at any moment. No faith is favored by the government and outside interests.

At present, the Republic of China on Taiwan has a total of nine religions: Buddhism, Taoism, Catholicism, Protestantism, Muslim Faith, Christianity, Islam, Tenkyo, and the Falun Gong. Since the government has adopted a policy of tolerance and protection, these nine religious sects have grown fourfold and quadrupled.
