#### Foreword

The field of Central Asian studies is vast and complex. It attracts scholars from many different disciplines and many different countries. Such diversity is very welcome. There is, however, often a problem of communication: those working in one area are often unaware of what is being done by others elsewhere with similar, or complementary interests. It is difficult enough to establish contact between scholars in the same country, let alone those who live thousands of miles apart.

This Research Register is a first, small step towards creating a regular channel of communication between scholars of Central Asian affairs. Its shortcomings are so obvious that it would be almost presumptuous to apologise for them. However, those of us who have been concerned with compiling this guide felt that it was better to print it now, with all its imperfections, rather than to wait indefinitely to gather more material. We have based it on the information submitted to the CENTRAL ASIA FILE over the last two years. Some contributors provided very detailed description of their work; others were considerably less expansive. We hope in the future to be able to provide a more even, consistent coverage.

The layout of the entries is self-explanatory: the contributor's name and address come first, followed by their regional specialisation and subject(s) of interest. There is an indication of work in progress, and a short reference to recent publications.
