

FROM THE SOVIET PRESS

PRAVDA VOSTOKA

14 July 1984, V. Berezovskii, "Oni Ushli na Rassvete" (They Went at Dawn." Biographies of young komsomols heroes killed by the Basmachi and

various religious fanatics and obscurantists.

7 August 1984, U. Bazarov, "S Veroi v Cheloveka" (With Faith in Man). Article on the work of Hamza Hakim Zade Niazi, a poet writing in the pre-Revolution and early Revolution period before being killed by "Muslim obscurantists." The article contains a violent and crude attack on Islam.

2 September 1984, Lt-Col V. Kostiukov, "Muzhestvo i Blagorodstvo" (Fortitude and Nobleness).

TASS. Author from the "limited contingent of Soviet Armed Forces in Afghanistan." Sugary article on the good deeds of the Soviet Armed Forces in Afghanistan. Insert at the beginning of the article says: "They participate in agricultural work, help eradicating the consequences of natural calamities. The fighters transport cargo, supply fuel and food, defuse the mines of the dushmans." Like in all similar articles the dushmans are described destroying schools and hospitals.

12 September 1984, F. Nesterenko, "Po Mandatu Lenina" (On Lenin's Madate). Whole page article on Frunze, Kuibishev and Radzutak. Insert at the top of the article (in thick characters) glorifies those having fought against the Basmachi and having established Soviet rule in Central Asia. There is only a passing reference to Fayzullah Khojaev and no mention of Muslim bolsheviks.

7 October 1984, Serafim Mel'nikov, "V Pokhodnoi Shineli" (In a Campaign Greatcoat). Episodes from the Basmachi war against Junaid Khan in the Turkmen steppes.

"Sovetskii Obraz Zhizni i Traditsii" (Soviet Way of Life and Tradition).
"The problem of overcoming survivals of the past...remains a topical question in our republic where in the past the Muslim religion deliberately preserved and strengthened, by all possible means, reactionary religious rites, regulated all aspects of family customs and morality and professed that without observing religious customs there was no real family life." The importance

of religious rites is still enormous, claims the author, the most tenacious being those connected with ones funeral and memorials of the dead and also marriage rites. "It has been noticed that under the pretext of observing national customs, the clergy takes part in civilian funerals. Presenting religious rites as national ones, the clergy is thus trying to preserve these rites among the population..." Umurzakova writes further: "It has been noted at the 16th Plenum of the Central Committee of the Communist Party of Uzbekistan that Party organisations do not appreciate the danger of survivals of the past...that there are cases when communists take part in religious rituals." The author then remarks that there have been "serious mistakes and miscalculations" in the political and ideological activity of Party organisations, that certain political leaders have not performed their duty as atheistic educators of the people. It is also mentioned that performing its "internationalist duty" Uzbekistan has sent 600 people between 1981 and 1983 to various projects such as BAM, KAMA plants and so on.

SOVETSKAIA KIRGIZIIA

18 August 1984, "Vystuplenie B. Karmalia" (B. Karmal's Speech). Long article filed by TASS from Kabul on the occasion of the 65th anniversary of Afghanistan independance. Lengthy article on the peace loving nature of the Kabul regime. It admits that Afghanistan is going through difficult times. For this Iran is now blamed together with Pakistan, China and the USA. The National Front of the Fatherland is praised and there are references to the importance of the land reform and on the measures taken to quarantee the equality of all Afghan nationalities. The article claims that there are now 117 training camps of "counter revolutionaries" in Pakistan, Iran and China.

29 August 1984, V. Smolianskii, "'Sovetologi'v Tupike" (Sovietologists in a Cul-de-sac). General attack on Western "ideologists", pointing out their lack of cohesion. (Also appeared in Kazakhstanskaia Pravda,

4 September 1984).

KOMMUNIST TADZHIKISTANA

Narodnoe Delo" (For People's Work). Article on the Basmachi war in Lokay. The author quotes extensively from Il'iutko's book "The Basmachi in Lokay", published in 1929, and gives special emphasis to the activity of the pro-bolshevik Muslim religious figures. Reference is even made to the 1st congress of the Lokay clergy in 1923 where it was decided that religion is not threatened by Soviet rule and that the Basmachi were enemies of Islam.

17 August 1984, V. Rudnitskii, "Nachalo" (The Beginning). Historical article on the establishment of the communist infrastructure in Tajikistan and Uzbekistan from 1917 to 1929, with references to the fight against the Basmachi.

19 August 1984, A. Valishev, "Krasnyi Mulla" (The Red Mullah). Long article by a veteran chekist of the Basmachi war in Lokay on the "Red Mullah" - qadi of Daganak.

15 September 1984, "SSSR-DRA: Druzhba Nerushima" (USSR-DRA: Indestructible Friendship). Long article on occasion of a meeting of Soviet and the Afghan komsomols. Present Afghan side Ahmad Farid were: Fakirmuhammed, secretary of the Afghan youth organisations, and Abdulsamad Qayum Abdulgaffur, minister education. Reference is made to 200 Afghans studying agronomy and economy in Dushanbe.

TURKMENSKAIA ISKRA

26 July 1984, M. Andreev, "Iskliuchenie iz Pravila" (The Exception to the Rule). In the column "We Live on the Border." Story of Lt Aleksandr Vasil'evich Parshin, a border guard, who has been wounded "defending the state's border" between 1981 and 1984.

August 1984, S. Demidov, "Astrakhanskie Turkmeny" (The Turkmens of Astrakhan). Historical anthropological article on the Turkmen community of Astrakhan.
