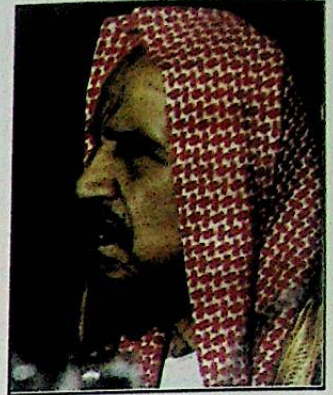


A Tribute to Shaikh Bin Baz
