This study, as first books, is a result of a long research. Hungarian Turcology dealing with the Turks of Eastern Europe and Central Asia has concentrated on the Turkic language history and mediaval history of the steppe, as early Hungarians were formed among Turkic peoples in the 6-9th centuries adapting Turkic, nomadic institutions. I have taken interest in the history of the Turkic nomads, as a student at the Department of Altaistics at Szeged University where Professor András Róna-Tas suggested that I deal with the history of the Volga Bulghars. I wrote my university doctorate in 1983 about the fall of the Volga Bulghar empire (*The Volga Bulghars in the early 13th century*) which has been published in parts (*The first Mongol raid against the Volga Bulghars*.
