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
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### Letter from the publishers

Brother Abdullah Schleifer, a veteran American journalist who is currently the TV consultant for NBC and a lecturer on mass communications in the American University in Cairo, was the first to respond to a request for helping Arabia's staff to evaluate the magazine's editorial policy and performance.

One of the major themes in Schleifer's comprehensive critique is that Arabia reduces the whole life of the Muslims to mere politics. 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
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
