On our own, we specialise in the publication of books on Islam and the Muslims.

The Flags of the independent Muslim countries which form the first annexure of this book are from the pictures of flags which we had secured from the U.N. The flag of Tanzania (The United Republic of Tanganyika and Zanzibar) was not available.

The Map of the Muslim World is the second annexure; it is a copy of the multi-coloured wall-size map prepared by the Motamar al-Alam al-Islami, which is available from us or the Motamar office. These artistically prepared maps are a 'must' in every Muslim institution and every Muslim home.

After the Gazetteer had gone to the press, certain changes have taken place in the Muslim world. The most important changes have been in Sudan and Saudi Arabia. In Sudan, the military regime has given place to a civilian government. King Feisal has replaced King Saud in Saudi Arabia.

We shall be thankful to receive from our readers any corrections or suggestions for improvement. As it is proposed to bring out the next edition of the World Muslim Gazetteer by the end of 1966, all suggestions should reach us before the middle of 1966.
